Housing and Health

- Housing not always a priority
- every £1 spent on providing housing support for vulnerable people nearly £2 is saved in reduced costs of health services, tenancy failure, crime and residential care.
- every £1 spent on energy efficient housing saves 42p in health costs

- 150 years of housing improvement in Birmingham prompted by a need to improve public health
- Post war Council build programmes
- Major slum clearance in inner city
- Overspill developments
